Book keeper's role – David Stevenson has volunteered to take over the book keeper roll after the end of March for which we are grateful.

Village Quiz at the Community Centre – Thank you to the team for putting in a spirited performance. The quiz was won by U3A, with Ladies Badminton 2nd, and the wine circle third and St Andrew's A team 4th. We think we came 6th out of 12.

Carols Round The Tree – Thanks to Bernard, Ray and helpers for fetching and erecting the tree. The small lights in the trees at the front of the centre, which FoT supplied a few years back and which are never taken down, had rotted, so a further 3 sets have been purchased, and Bernard is putting those up for everybody. The new ones cost over £66. Maybe they should be taken down each year so they last longer? There has also been a suggestion that a permanent Christmas Tree be planted as we are having difficulties now sourcing one each year. It is unclear at present who would pay for this if it were purchased.

Presents and toys for children – We put in for a 100 packs of toys (free) from GivingWorldonline, and have been successful. It is intended to give these to the centre for the Carols Round The Tree event, so each child coming along gets a gift. Surveys will have to be completed by 50 recipients of the gifts for the charity.

History report

- Ann has been to tape three people talking about their **memories**. This includes a gentleman who came to the village in the 1960s as a child from the NE. From these talks, we now know more about the land on which the Council houses on Henson's Lane were built, and where the Melrose Road estate now stands. We also have an idea of the differences faced by people from the NE who came to the village in the 1960s at the same time as the Scottish. We have also spoken briefly to a gentleman who came with his 6 children from Durham, and have spoken at length to another gentleman who came from High Spen near Newcastle at the same time and written up his story. Both these gents are in their late 80s.
- We have been trying to find out from the family what is the up to date position regarding the renovation of Charles Booth's grave but have heard nothing yet. We understand properties near St Andrew's have had letters asking if they have objections to the renovations.
- A talk on **WW1 memorials** held at Snibston's Century Theatre raised the fact that one of the people we have been researching for the proposed booklet next year is also commemorated on the Bardon church memorial. This was unknown to us before the talk was given.
- We have spoken with a lady who ran a hosiery factory in the late 1970s from **The Old School House**. We are now looking for further information, as she has said that the property also, at one time, housed a boat building business. If anybody is able to help with further information, please get in touch. Kath Ingall who was working behind the bar suggested we contact Roger Munsey or Ann and Richard Randall to talk about the knitwear factory.
- We have researched **the Webb family** – Daniel Amos Webb and his son John Henry were very prominent in the village, acting as church wardens, parish wardens, as well as an overseer, school manager and chair of the parish council (in the case of Daniel). The whole family has been researched and links found between the Waldram coal merchants, Biddle's (grocers) and Vesty family (farmers) and the Webb's. All we need now is some photographic help if there is any out there. We have also now made a list of church and parish wardens.
- We have been talking to a lady from the County Council who is trying to set up a **Green Plaque scheme**. This is intended to be village biased, and to celebrate people who have made an impact on their community. We feel this would be useful as far as our link with

Charles Booth is concerned, and could bring added publicity to the village and Thringstone House. The church have said that if the plaque is granted for Charles Booth, they would like to have a service of thanksgiving for the life and works of Charles Booth at St Andrew's.

- David Astill has donated a lot of finds from **Gracedieu Priory** to the Friends of Gracedieu Priory. This could be potentially useful as aids when undertaking talks with school children.

Councillors' report

- District Council Budget

North West Leicestershire District Council is now midway through the 2014 budget setting process. Next week the Cabinet will meet to decide on how they will tackle the pressing budget deficit of £500,000 in 2014/15 escalating to £2,800,000 in 2017/18.

Following a consultation exercise the following proposals have been put forward for adoption.

Barring any last minute changes of mind, which would be exceptionally unlikely, these proposals will be introduced in April 2014.

- *Introducing an annual charge of £30 for fortnightly collection of garden waste bins. A charge of £25 a year will apply to smaller garden waste bins. (A £5 discount will be applied for those who pay the charge by direct debit.)*
- *No longer returning to collect 'unjustified missed bins'.*
- *Increasing parking charges in town centre car parks*
- *To start charging 'concessions' 50% for bulky waste collections.*
- *To start charging 'concessions' 50% for treating wasps, fleas and bedbugs.*
- *To start charging 'concessions' 50% for casual swimming (75% next year).*
- *To stop giving Community Grants.*
- *To stop publishing 'Vision' magazine.*
- *To significantly scale back the role of district council 'Chairman'.*

- County Council Budget

Following the 'Leicestershire's Future' consultation exercise the County Council budget is currently being finalised but proposals are not expected to be published until early January 2014. I hope to bring you more information next month however significant cuts, council tax and fee increases are to be expected.

- Thringstone Parish Council - Community Governance Review Petition

Approximately half of the required signatures (250) to initiate a Community Governance Review for the establishment of a Thringstone Parish Council have now been gathered.

I am hopeful that the petition will be presented to North West Leicestershire District Council in January. In that event the District Council would conduct a consultation exercise to formally gather the views of local residents with a Parish Council, if that is the preferred outcome, established in time for the local elections in May 2015.

pay extra attention with regards to making sure all windows and doors are locked and secure. Do not leave anything of value on show like laptops, phones, car keys, etc. Try to leave a light on or set a timer switch if you will be out in hours of darkness. If anyone sees anything that concerns them, please do not hesitate to call it in on 101.

Gardening and environment

- NWLDC have cut off **overhanging branches** to trees by the Sustrans between the Springfield entrance and the viaduct. This is to aid visibility to walkers/cyclists etc., and prevent more leaves on the track.
- NWLDC's parks department planted **rose bushes** on the bedding near the Melrose Play area in the same place as they previously planted shrubs which lasted a week before they were dug up and slung round the play area. Children have continued to cycle over this part of the flowerbed as they have always done, and within 2 days many of the roses were flattened. This has been reported to the parks department with a suggestion that they flatten that end of the flowerbed and grass it.
- Various **flytipping** reported to the council over the last month has been removed.

- Pam said that Chris Mellor (one of our former members) is now quite ill and requiring more concentrated care.
