History report

- We have been keen to find more information on families who lived at **The Warren.** We found details confirming that The Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate took possession of The Warren from the de Lisle family on 5 September 1845 and left on 3 July 1847, and we know of further missionaries there around the turn of the 20th century. We know that the Westgates lived there in more recent times, and found a photograph of Dick and Bridie Westgate and their children on line, together with photos of Dick's mother, Mrs Emily Lily Westgate nee Pearce, and her children. We now know Emily's husband to be John Westgate although nothing further can be found on line regarding him. We are, however, now in contact with a lady who is the great granddaughter of Emily Westgate and hope to receive more information, and maybe even photographs.
- Friends of Grace Dieu Priory has been working with others on the pond near the ruins. Loughborough Naturalist Group has advised that they found microscope slides of algae from the pond near **the ruins.** The algae were collected by Frederick Bates on 4 Aug 1884. He was the brother of Henry Walter Bates, of *Theory of Evolution* fame. The species of algae prove that the water quality was "pristine" back then.
- We are currently trying to investigate any details we can on **John Knight** who, according to a recent talk Ann attended, was a pot hawker or manufacturer in Thringstone in 1690.

Councillors' report – Leon Spence

Leon was at another meeting and had not provided a report. However, the following was mentioned.

- Cllr. Spence has again reported to the relevant authority the problems with people on Loughborough Road **parking on the grass verges.**
- The County Council is conducting an **internet superfast broadband project** for rural areas. It is unclear whether Thringstone is covered by this, but it is known that the exchange for BT for Thringstone's coverage is based in Osgathorpe, and runs on copper wire, so that by the time the signal gets to Thringstone, it is drastically reduced. If you are affected by slow broadband, please tell Cllr. Spence, as he is trying to produce a map of the area showing people affected.
- Choose How You Move there was a public meeting at Whitwick Community Enterprises on 25 November to which people who had completed the County Council survey were invited. 11 people from Whitwick and Thringstone went along. Various issues to do with local bus services were discussed such as no direct service to the airport, no access between villages (so people from Thringstone can't go to Belton or Osgathorpe directly), lack of timetables, problems with buses being on time, and the cost of the service. The lack of a park and ride service on the Groby Road in Leicester was also discussed, as were issues to do with cycle tracks locally, and the lack of information on what is available around the Thringstone area and the fact that the packs sent out to people locally did not include a train timetable for Loughborough. This was omitted because the consultants did

not fully appreciate that people from this area who wanted a train would need to go into Loughborough and might have an interest in a timetable. This consultation exercise was carried out by Integrated Transport Planning Ltd., a Nottingham company, employed by the County Council, and everybody who attended the public meeting was paid £20 for going along. Following this meeting, a further 16 page survey was sent to people to complete. The money for this consultation has come out of the money paid to the county council to cover, for example, the provision of the cycle paths.

The meeting said that there is a park and ride into Leicester near the junction of the inner ringroad.

Police Report for last 31 days (PCSO Mark Ball)

Someone tried to break into the back of Thringstone Members Club over night on 13/14 November. They failed in their attempt, but the doors were badly damaged.

A further theft occurred at the Co-op on 13 November. Sadly the Co-op was targeted again after that but we do have some leads to follow.

The Bull's Head has taken a bit if a hit recently, in that a person had their number plates taken and other persons have had their coats taken when they have left them over chairs and gone for food/cigarette. Enquiries are continuing, but it may be a good time to tell anyone you or your members meet that if anyone attends <u>any</u> location to leave their coats/bags in the boot of their car locked and secure and if possible to not all leave the table at the same time, but have one person remain with their possessions, I know this is the party season but sadly some less desirable members of our society also know.

We have not yet seen any increase on thefts from motor vehicles. I have noted in the past few years that at this time we see an increase in trade's persons' vehicles being targeted. Plumbers especially seem to stock pile the piping and like to take this to a scrap dealer as a little extra bonus Christmas spending money, but once again our undesirables know this and will target their sheds/vans for the metal. So far fingers crossed nothing yet.

We have spoken with PC James Broomfield about **parking on grass verges** following various comments made to us since the last meeting. He said he will see if there is anything he can do to dissuade people from parking on the grass verges.

We also wish to pass on information shared with us about the folly of stating what you are doing over Christmas, when you are going out etc, by posting information like this on facebook. **Thieves may be watching your facebook page** and, if local, can easily find out your address and target your property whilst you are out.

Gardening and environment

- There are several large and several small pieces of carpet dumped on the **Sustrans track** along with some cardboard boxes. These are on the part of the track that runs alongside the football pitch at the rear of the bowls club. This was reported to the Sustrans Ranger, as there is too much for our existing litter pickers to remove unaided, and removed by the Sustans Ranger the same day.
- Bernard has been busy tidying up **flowerbeds and planting** the Christmas tree. We gave him 12 wild cherry trees which we acquired from NWLDC's Green Footprints team. These have been planted down the Drury Lane wall shared with the community centre.
- The owner of land adjoining Drury Lane has now fenced off his land from the rear wall of The Co-op down to the gate to **Bob's Closs**. This has made the area more compact and

tidy. He then asked if Bernard could get and plant some hawthorn plants to put down by the fencing to form a hedge, and said he would then pay for extra plants for FoT. This was organized and plants purchased on 3 and 4 December with the cost being passed to the owner who has subsequently reimbursed us.
