Monthly litter pick total – 110 bags against 157 for the same month last year. There was some flytipping on Melrose Road by the banking to the woods which then went into the bushes. Nita cleared this up – it was all household rubbish and lots of **very** smelly nappies. Some of the 5 bags split whilst being taken away which wasn't very pleasant to deal with. NWLDC informed. Other flytipping on Turlough Road and on Melrose Road was reported to NWLDC and the council are considering putting cameras in on Melrose Road.

There was also an incident on the A512 where a lorry shed lots of loose paper towels over the roadway and footpaths. Nita cleared up a lot of this by the George and Dragon and on the footpaths to the houses, helped by Bill Enser, and then NWLDC, who were told about it by Nita, came with a crew of 8 men and cleared the verges and hedgerows.

Marking the end of WW1 – we are in the process of putting together a bid for funding to NWLDC to allow us to put on an exhibition and also music event at the centre on 10 November to commemorate the end of the war period, and reflect the amount of optimism around at the time. Women in particular had undergone huge changes to their lives during the period of the war, and were now often working for a living. In addition, from November 1918, following the granting of votes for women over the age of 30, many women were looking more towards the future than at any time in the past. As you may know, we did a 3 day event in 2014 to mark the start of the war. For that event, we received £100 from EM Airport fund, £100 from St Andrew's, £50 from Coalville Rotary, £25 from Thringstone Co-op, the centre made a banner, and Kay at the shop provided biscuits and nibbles. As the event this time could include a band and dancing, we need to put in a larger funding bid, and NWLDC have one available, but this needs to be match funded. We will keep everybody posted on what is happening with this event and the bid for a grant. In the meantime, the centre has ordered a quantity of large poppies to go on lampposts for the event. This year is Whitwick Historical Group's 35th anniversary and they are planning an event to celebrate this in October. They would be pleased to join us but their input will be limited due to their other event. Their current thoughts are that they would be able to prepare two or three boards as part of your display

Police Report

- Vehicle Crime - Main Street Thringstone between 10,30pm on 31 January and 12noon on 1 February, a vehicle left locked and secure on driveway of home address returned to find entry had been gained by unknown means and property was stolen.
- Burglary Other Loughborough Road Unknown person has broken into the garage by forcing the front door and then forced the van door and numerous power tools have been stolen.
- Theft – between 6pm and 10pm on 12 February - a row of 5 new panels from fencing to a currently vacant rental property in Main Street had been removed and one taken by a local person for use on his own property.

History report

We will be working with the centre to put on another **Hello Heritage Event** this year – the date for the 2018 event being 15 September. The event will run from 12 noon until 5pm. Maureen said that she now has a copy of **burial registers** from 1967 onwards which she will share with our group.

In our book Thringstone and Its People, we talk about Elms Farm and Jason Herriot Reeves White, who we believe was also at one time the manager at Snibston Colliery and we knew to be at Elms Farm in 1887. His wife, Mrs Louisa White who bought the community centre as **Thringstone House** on 9 September 1899 from Tom Hurst, and sold it to Charles Booth for £700 on 25 March 1901, was originally Louisa Knight of Stordon Grange, daughter of John and Ann, who, on leaving Stordon Grange, lived at Vine House, Osgathorpe. She was described on the deeds as Louisa White, wife of Jason Herriott Reeves White, Gentleman. She was born in 1852 and died on 11 September 1922 at Forest View, St George's Hill, Coleorton, now part of Swannington, where she seems to have lived for some years, previously living on St George's Hill with a Mary Tugby and her

brother, John Griffin. When she died, she left £14,938 0s 4d. She was buried at St George's, Swannington on 14 September 1922. The census of 1911 tells us that she had had one child who had died. She had married Jason Herriot Reeves White on 26 August 1873 at St Mary's, Osgathorpe. The service was conducted by Rev Walter A Williams. The notice in the newspapers at the time of the marriage asked for no cards to be sent, which is rather odd. By 1881, the couple were living at Spring Cottages, Hugglescote. Jason was born on 24 April 1851 in Hoxton, Middlesex, the eldest son of John Puxley White, in 1861 the chief clerk to the Snibston Colliery company, and his wife Mary Ann. Mr White Snr. went on to become an accountant and farmer in Mount Pleasant, Osgathorpe, before moving back to live at The Scotlands, Hugglescote, to work again in the colliery business. He was a county councillor and alderman in 1892 and subsequently became a JP. Jason died in Northampton Lunatic Asylum on 29 December 1916. The last local census on which he appears is 1891 when he and Louisa were the farmers at Elms Farm, Osgathorpe. He is listed as civil mining engineer and farmer. They seem to have been there from at least 1885, as there are newspaper reports about the theft and killing of a lamb from Mr White at that time by a Mr Thomas King, who was sentenced to 6 months hard labour.

Jason was admitted to Wye House Lunatic Asylum in Kent on 6 December 1888 and was released on 11 May 1889. He obviously then came back to Elms Farm to be on the 1891 census, but was obviously taken ill again, as between 12 December 1892 and 10 January 1904, he was again in Wye House Asylum. We know he was in hospital at the Northampton Lunatic Asylum in Billing Road Northampton in 1911, as the census says his occupation was formerly mining engineer and states that he had been a lunatic for 52 years. Given that he was only 57 this is a sad record. We are unable to find out when he went to Northampton, but his probate says that is where he also died, and he left £6,359 11s 6d to his wife. He was also buried at St George's, Swannington on 2 January 1917. We are currently unsure when it was built, but Thringstone House was a farm and is shown as such on the enclosure map of 1807. At the time of the sale of Thringstone House to Charles Booth it had stables, gardens and outbuildings and was then in the occupation of **William Kirby**, and there was a butcher's shop adjoining it which was in the occupation of a **Mr Tolley**, possibly Henry Tolley who lived on Loughborough Road, Thringstone according to the 1911 census. Home Close, now called Bob's Closs was 3 acres, 2 roods and nineteen perches. The 1901 census shows William Kirby aged 66 living on Main Street, occupation gardener, with Mary Cooke as his housekeeper. On 23 August 1902, Charles Booth sold to the blacksmith **Jabez Henson** 134 sq. yards of the land around the centre. On 4 June 1909, **Ethel Annie Biddle**, wife of John Biddle of Gracedieu Road, bought 431 sq yards of the land and on 16 July 1909, **George William Ward** bought 659 sq yards of the land. He lived in Fern Cottage, which is the Victorian property next to the centre's entrance driveway.

Documents kept by the centre show that **Ernest Aris** who lived in Church Lane, Whitwick and who died in October 1966 was chair of the governors at the community centre for a

long time. It has been suggested that he was an MBE, although we can't find records to authenticate this, and had also served for decades on the management and executive committees

We have been told that **Roy Severn** ran the youth club at the centre in the 1950s. A gent called Kenneth Berkin who now lives in Kent used to help. If anybody has any further information on the youth club in the 1950s, please let us know.

We have been looking at the career at the centre of caretaker **Jackie Hurst** who left at the end of October 1966 and hadn't realised that he started as caretaker at the centre in 1925. In May 1966, **Miss Judith Stinson** resigned as deputy warden to get married to Stanley Buck, having worked at the centre for 2 and a half years. We also now understand that **Dr Muir**, who at the time lived in Homestead Road, was a governor at the community centre from 1967 at which time a Mrs A Smith was deputy warden. Dr Muir was chair of the governors for about 3 years in the early 1970s.

In 1971 the centre employed **Eric and Emma Butterworth** who did cleaning. We understand that they also helped with the bar and light refreshments. We are told that Eric Butterworth had been the caretaker at the primary school prior to working at the centre and Emma had helped at the school with cleaning. Born on 30 December 1919, prior to getting married in 1943 to Emma Roberts, Eric had previously lived at 78 Meadow Lane with his siblings, Jack, May who married Gerald Harris, and Arthur. He had been a builder's labourer. Later on he lived on Homestead road and then in the bungalow in the school grounds which were changed into the Sure Start Centre. He died there on 17 August 1978. Emma and Eric had 3 daughters, Pauline, Elaine and May. Pauline married Don Badcock, and her son, Stephen was the person who put together Thringstone Online history pages, which are now connected again to our website, as mentioned earlier, and who was a staunch supporter of St Andrew's church. We also now find that **Alan Lucas** from Lucas Mart was a governor at the centre in the 1970s through to around 1994.

Alan Randall, who was deputy head at the local school, was warden at the community centre in 1972 and 1973 and was followed by Ann Hicken.
