We do this by various means, including undertaking planting projects to improve the appearance of the village, by working with other agencies on ensuring a clean, safe and welcoming environment for all, by keeping members informed of all village activities, and by listening and responding to people's concerns affecting their life within the village. This often involves working with other agencies to help solve difficulties being experienced.

RECENT WORK UNDERTAKEN

Work on our planting project on Drury Lane has progressed well with trees, shrubs and plants already in place. We would like to thank Midland Quarry Products for their help with this project.

Several tons of litter have been removed from the village and surrounding woodland by our group. April 2006

We continue to liaise with Friends of Grace Dieu Priory on their open event.

We have worked with Environ to help promote composting and awareness of environmental issues affecting all at their open day on 7th May at Thringstone Community Centre.

FUTURE WORK PLANNED

We will be present at the opening of Grace Dieu Priory and also at the Picnic in the Parks, (NWLDC's flagship summer event).

We are also improving our profile by distributing additional posters and leaflets

Working to improve other areas of Thringstone after our present conservation project has ended. This may possibly include improvements to footpath M97 off Glebe Road, a planting project at Lily Bank, and other areas.

We are in negotiations with the local authorities to provide a National Forest sign at the entrance to the village and to provide other signage reflecting Thringstone's history. Following discussions with NWLDC's Director of Environment, we are hopeful that better litter facilities will become available within the village and that dog foul bins will be placed along the SUSTRANS track in Grace Dieu woods.

We are seeking funding so that we can provide a small leaflet on the history of the village, which would be available for tourists. Thringstone has a long and chequered history, and we would like to see the village itself be part of the tourist trail, (as well as encouraging people to visit Grace Dieu Priory), which could potentially help our local businesses and hostelries.


Any changes in venue will be announced in the local newspapers in 'What's on', but if you want more immediate information, please contact any of our committee, names given below, who will be pleased to help.
