elcome to our final newsletter of 2008, produced and delivered free of charge to residents of Thringstone, by Friends of Thringstone.

The period leading up to Christmas can be a really hectic time for most families, and whilst the same applies within our group, we are busy making plans for 2009, looking at what we can do within the village and areas where improvements would be welcome.

We discuss these plans at our meetings. If you think that there are things we should be looking at, please let us know by coming to our meetings and putting your voice across. We are a really friendly group and are willing to consider all points of view.

Friends of Thringstone can only operate if we have members who are willing to take part and help with things we plan. Our meetings are held at 6.45pm at Thringstone Community Centre, and our 2009 meetings will be held on 8th January 2009, 19th February 2009, March 12th 2009, April 16th 2009, May 21st 2009, June 11th 2009, July 9th 2009, September 10th 2009, October 8th 2009, November 12th 2009 and December 10th 2009.

What are we up to right now?

- We are hosting a drop in meeting at the community centre to look at old photos of Thringstone and talk about things as they used to be on Thursday 20th November from 2-4pm. We are still working on putting together a full archive list of old photographs of the village, and intend eventually to produce a booklet of photographs of Thringstone now and then.
- We have finished planting at The Community Centre, and by the church wall which runs from Loughborough Road towards Main Street.
- We hosted a visit by Citrus Group to talk to members about their plans for The Fox site.
- We joined in with Thringstone Primary School as part of NWLDC'S Big Tidy campaign, have linked with the army cadets, leaders and explorers and other young people to do a clean up within the woodland area, and are continuing to carry out our own litter picks in the village.
- We are hopeful of being able to work with the church to donate some money towards the restoration and cleaning of Charles Booth's grave within St Andrew's churchyard.
- We have now achieved a good link with Coalville's Town Twinning links in Romanssur-Isere to discuss best practice on environmental themes.

Membership of our group is just £2.50, and for that you will get a full membership, which will last through to the AGM in June. You will also receive copies of all the minutes of meetings held during the year, whether you were present or not.

COMMUNITY CENTRE

Thringstone Community Centre has rooms available for week night parties free! If you want to use the bar lounge which accommodates up to 40 people, bring your own food, but agree to use the fully staffed bar, we could help you.

Weekend hire of the upstairs main hall costs from $\pounds 65$. This room accommodates up to 100 people, is ideal for family parties and celebrations, and there is an adjacent kitchen and staffed licensed bar.

The lounge/middle function room is also available to hire from £60. This facility is on the ground floor and can accommodate 50 people, so is ideal for a small family gathering. There is a kitchen nearby and wheelchair access. The facility has a staffed licensed bar.
