elcome to our final newsletter of 2009, produced and delivered free of charge to residents of Thringstone, by Friends of Thringstone.

Big news from us this newsletter is that Friends of Thringstone won an Outstanding Achievement Award at the East Midlands In Bloom Neighbourhood Awards 2009, at a civic presentation in Nottingham.

The judging, which took place in July, took into account our floral planting schemes, our general landscaping works, the cleanliness of the village and lack of litter, and the overall impression of the village as a whole.

Out of a possible 200 marks, we scored 171, and are delighted that our work has been recognised at a regional level.

What are we up to right now?

- We are continuing to link with the school and with NWLDC and local businesses on various projects. This includes the possibility of archeological investigations at the former Thringstone Halt, part of the Charnwood Forest Railway line which ran through the area, and connected with the station in Whitwick.
- Do you have any photographs of the village in days gone by? We are looking to extend our archives, and are always on the look out for new photographs. We are especially keen to hear from anybody with photographs of the 1950s or 1960s or who might wish to be recorded talking about the village in those decades.
- We are also in need of some Grandma's Favourite Recipes. If you have any old recipes that might be of interest, let us know, as we are considering putting together a brochure of photographs of the village in the past and combining these with old recipes. Please contact our Chairman if you can help with this.

- We have organised our bulb planting ready for next Spring. We are also intending to look towards continued seasonal planting in some areas.
- Our walks programme has now finished for the year, but a full programme of historical and health walks has been put together for 2010, to include walks as part of the National Forest Walks Festival at the end of May. Our first walk in 2010 will be on 14th March. Further details in the next newsletter. Thanks to all those people who have supported our walks during the year.
