What else is happening?

- 5 June TUESDAY BANK HOLIDAY HERITAGE SHOW- We will be at Thringstone House Community Centre from 2pm-5pm with all our archives and photographic display of events in the past. Please come along and have a look at what we have available and talk to us about your memories of the village and its characters. There will be Songs From The Shows on at the centre from 5pm-6pm, so stay afterwards and enjoy the music!
- **Thank you** to members of the 1188 Coalville Air Cadets for their work with us in March to clear the village of litter. A staggering 38 bags of litter, plus other items of rubbish, were removed, which is the most we have been able to collect and get taken away since 2008 when we had a full environmental day. Many thanks also to our members who continue to keep the village clean and tidy on a daily basis.
- We have been initially interviewed by a producer from Landmark Films about a documentary they are putting together for the BBC on litter in this country and why other countries do not appear to have similar problems.
- Our project to move the **flowerbed on The Green** away from overhanging trees so that the planting we do stands a better chance of survival was delayed, but is still taking place later in the year. We may start the new flowerbed before moving the old, and still intend changing the bed from a raised one to a flat one. If anybody wants to help us with this, please get in touch.

- We were pleased to be asked to be involved with helping keep the village clean and tidy for the Jubilee celebrations
- We have been asked to take part in the Coalvilletwenty 12 event at Coalville Park to celebrate the Jubilee and Olympics and have a stall.
- Our graveyard booklet on St Andrew's, which has taken 2 years to get into print, is now available.
- As a result of discussions with people who have shown an interest in our new graveyard booklet, we are looking to form a Reminiscence Group and put on new taping sessions, either at the Community Centre or in people's homes, for people to talk about their memories of the village. If you would like to be part of this reminiscence group, please get in touch.
- We are looking to plant more daffodil bulbs around the village later this year so that next spring all entrances to the village look colourful.
- We are taking part in the St Andrew's Church Flower Festival on 2 and 3 June. The parish church will be decorated with flowers following a theme of hymns. Friends of Thringstone's hymn is For The Beauty Of The Earth. All are welcome. The church will be open for people to view the flowers for an hour from 9.30am on the Saturday morning and between 1pm and 5pm on the Saturday afternoon and from 2pm-5pm on the Sunday. There is also a 10am Thanksgiving Service on 3 June to which all are welcome.
- We are starting to put together a funding bid, through the Heritage Lottery Funding stream, called All Our Stories. We have to get the funding bid in by the end of July, and are working hard to ensure this is done. This could allow us to improve and increase our history work within the village.
