elcome to our last newsletter of 2012, produced and delivered free of charge to residents of Thringstone, and parts of Whitwick, by Friends of Thringstone.



What is happening?

- Carols Round The Tree at Thringstone House Community Centre takes place on Friday 14 December from St Andrew's Church at 6.30pm for a lantern procession to the Thringstone House Community Centre, getting there for 6.45pm. Come along and sing your favourite carols with an invited choir, then come into the centre for refreshments (hot soup, minced pies and mulled wine) and have fun with a family sing a long. The bar will be open.
- We have planted more shrubs in the flowerbed on The Green for which we are responsible, which will cut down on the amount of work needed in that area, and intend at some stage to remove the grass down Drury Lane and plant shrubs there for similar reasons. We have planted a lot of spring bulbs on The Green, and elsewhere in the village, to give some colour around spring time.
- We are still waiting to hear whether we have been successful in our Heritage Lottery bid to work with archeologists and Leicester University on finding out more of the history of the village. In the meantime, we have bought a Zoom Hi digital recorder and other apparatus to help us record people's lives to then type these up for posterity. If you would like us to tape you talking about your memories of the village get in touch. We can record you talking about how you came to the village from elsewhere for example, or again if you were born here and have seen the changes with new housing estates going up and

remember some of the families of the We are currently collating past. transcripts of various tapes already typed up, where these have not been published, and are looking to consider publishing these, in small quantities, at some stage in the future.

- We are still trying to collect copies of old photographs of any of the events held in the village in the past. We can scan anything given to us and return the originals to you. Please let us know if you can help. We are especially interested in photos from the 1970s onwards.
- We are also still working on a project to record the lives of people who kept pubs in the village. If anybody can help at all with this, even if it is just to tell us your memories of some of the pubs no longer open, please get in touch. We would especially like to hear from anybody whose family kept pubs here, and any photos would be especially welcome.
- We have continued doing regular and event litter picks around the village, and have picked up in excess of 2,250 bags full since we started in 2005. NWLDC are now advertising that they can supply people who want to help reduce litter in the area with a litter picking pack.
