# What is happening?

 VILLAGE SCARECROW EVENT IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THRINGSTONE METHODISTS 150<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY.

Have you decided to have a scarecrow as part of the village scarecrow event which we are running alongside the Methodist Chapel's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations? There is still time to join in and be part of this terrific event in the village.



This will take place on Saturday 6th July and run from 10am until 4pm, with the event all kicking off at Thringstone Methodist Chapel Hall, The Green. On the day, the Methodist Chapel Hall will be open, and in addition to the scarecrows, there will be a slide show at the church hall at 10.30am and again at 3pm, teas and refreshments, a raffle, history and plant stalls and plenty

for children hopefully including an old fire engine to look at and explore.

There is a £3 fee to take part in the scarecrow event, for which you will get straw to make your scarecrow. Thringstone Brownie and Rainbow groups are judging the event, and there will be 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes which will be awarded after 4pm at the Chapel Hall. We will be providing maps so that people can walk round the village and see the scarecrows. This is a great opportunity to join with the Methodist Church, celebrate their history within our village, and have some fun.

- Once again, Friends of Thringstone reached the final 3 in the 2013 Green Footprints Awards, Partnership and Community Category. Thanks to all who continue to help us during the year with litter picking, planting, events and archive gathering for our history projects. We removed over 125 bags of rubbish, litter, bottles, cans etc. from the village in just April alone and for the first time took part in the Earth Day campaign on 22<sup>nd</sup> April.
- We are continuing to maintain and replant areas of the village for which we are responsible. The village looked lovely when Spring finally arrived and the daffodils came out, but yet again some of our planting was vandalised. We have bought more shrubs and plants and will continue to work hard so



that the village looks good during the coming months.

   This is a collection of writings from three villagers and is shortly to be available at the usual outlets.
