What is happening?

- Thank you to all who came out on a very windy night to support Carols Round The Tree at the Community Centre. It was a lovely evening. £107 in total was collected by the church and sent to Christian Aid.
- Litter continues to be a problem in our village. In two weeks in December, we removed 50 bags of litter each week from our village. Records kept by us show that from 1 February 2013 to 31 December 2013, our group removed 1,678 bags of litter from this village and surrounding woodland. Government statistics suggest that the majority of people who drop litter are in the 21-40 age range, so we are not just talking children here. If you would like to help us keep the village clean and tidy, please get in touch, or come on one of our community litter pick mornings. Conversely, if you see litter in the street, you can help by picking it up as you pass and putting it in a bin. There are plenty of bins around the village. Our next community litter pick is on 8 March, meeting at 10am from The Green. All are welcome.
- Things slow down from a gardening angle over this period, but we are looking forward to better weather and the opportunity to replace dead shrubs and planting so that the village looks bright as the season progresses.
- **NEW PUBLICATION** We are pleased to announce another new publication which is a 150 page bound book called

Thringstone and Its People. It details life in the village from the early 1800s through to the late 1950s and has taken 18 months to research and write. It is available from 1st March at a cost of £6. Please contact us if you would like to have a copy. We do intend to give a free copy to the Primary School for their library.

- We are still looking for information from people who ran or worked at a business from the village, including village shops and factories. Photos would be good, but information is vital. We have a gap in our knowledge in particular with regard to a boat builder who worked out of The Old School House in the 1960s, and the hosiery factories that were at the Wesleyan Chapel prior Carol Whitehead taking it over as a fitness centre in the 1990s. We especially would like to know who had the property after Terry Farmer left there. Any information would be very welcome, so please contact us on the number above.
- Do you have photos we could scan? Did you go to school in Thringstone and still have a copy of your class photograph, or were you in a panto or nativity play? Do you have photos of the village celebrating the Queen's Silver Jubilee in 1977 or Charles and Diana's wedding in 1981? We are looking for photographs to put in our archives, to include village events, families and weddings, right up to the 1990s. If you have anything you are willing to share,

please let us know. The main thing is it has to be specific to Thringstone.
