News from Drs Virmani & Bedi's Practice Patient Participation Group.

When I phone for a doctor's appointment why might I be asked to tell the receptionist what's wrong?

Things are changing in general practice, and some surgeries, such as Drs Virmani and Bedi at Whitwick Health Centre, now employ a team of health professionals to provide the patient care that doesn't need to be given by a GP. The team may include nurses, an advanced nurse practitioner, a clinical pharmacist and health care assistants.

To ensure that you see the right person, the receptionist who answers your call may ask you certain questions so that they can offer you an appointment with the person who can best help you. This will ensure that you receive appropriate treatment, and will also allow the doctor to prioritise those patients who need to be seen in the surgery, or to have a visit or a telephone consultation with a doctor.

Receptionists have the same duty of confidentiality as doctors and everyone else in the practice. They aren't being nosey, merely trying to help you. All the health care professionals work as a team, and will pass you on to the doctor there and then if

needed.
